

A short history of Hadleigh

Hadleigh is an ancient Suffolk market town set in the fertile valley of the River Brett.

We are one of the significant Wool Towns that prospered from the Woollen Cloth Trade during the late 15th to the 17th Century.

We are fortunate that the town has preserved its past and its character with 250 listed buildings. Amongst these are the fine Guildhall, St Mary's church and Deanery Tower that create a unique setting.

Six buildings of architectural merit, covering six different centuries can be seen from this place.

The busy High St has retained many of its independent traders and family businesses, that always delight our visitors.

Twentieth century artist and plantsman Sir Cedric Morris, established his school of painting and drawing here.

The Gayfords, Oswald, a pioneering aviator and sister Eily, also known as Kitty; one of the few dedicated "Idle Women" were both born in Hadleigh and all are part of our story.

1. Hadleigh Past and Present




A Viking King, a fearless long distance aviator and an artist and plantsman are all part of our story.
